

## **NetSafe Utah Grant Sustainability Program – March 28, 2014 Sustainability Program**

**What is the goal?** Overall, to increase the safety of Utah students as they access the Internet. NetSafe is funded by the Utah legislature through the Sexual Exploitation of Children Prevention fund administered by the Commission on Criminal and Juvenile Justice Services.

**What else?** This year, our goal is to develop a Cadre of NetSafe Utah trainers, coordinating with rural regional service centers, school districts, and charter schools to conduct local programs that teach NetSafe Utah Internet safety.

**Who is involved?** Participating districts/schools/charters will be reimbursed for a portion of their NetSafe expenses if they complete the following and submit documentation using the approved procedures at the end of their project(s):

*(Districts served by a Regional Service Center and schools served by the Utah Charter School Board should coordinate with those entities to make the best use of the funds available.)*

- Designate one or more district/school/regional center staff members to be members of the NetSafe Trainer Cadre
- Cadre members participate in one or more NetSafe Utah online webinars taught by UEN trainer Rob Bentley – these will be held monthly starting this summer
- Cadre members complete two or more local training sessions for teachers, students, or parents and submit post-training completion reports (completion reports to include data on attendees/participants and itemization detailing local NetSafe project activities)
- Cadre members receive print and online materials to support their local workshops.
- Cadre members agree to have their name and contact information placed on the NetSafe website through 2016 so schools may contact them to facilitate workshops locally.

Participants will be reimbursed up to the following amounts:

- \$2,000 per District (up to 42 Districts)
- \$1,000 per Charter School (up to 20 Charter Schools) – coordinate with Marlies Burns
- \$2,000 per Regional Service Center (up to four centers)
- \$1,000 additional for Districts with greater than 10,000 students (Alpine, Box Elder, Cache, Canyons, Davis, Granite, Jordan, Nebo, Ogden, Provo, Salt Lake, Tooele, Washington, Weber)

Reimbursements will be toward expenses qualifying workshops held in your local area. Cadre districts, schools service centers must submit performance metrics and backup evidence including agendas, attendance logs, etc. documenting workshops.

Details about the documentation and reimbursement process will be covered during the monthly NetSafe webinars. **ALL workshops and documents must be submitted to UEN using the approved procedures by February 28, 2015.**
